






- 60 % of children diagnosed by two years (56.6% Metropolitan Auckland, 72% Tai Tokerau)









- 16.6% of children have a cochlear implant or have an implant pending
- 23% of children have English plus another spoken language occurring in their lives. For 6% this language is Te Reo
- 7% of children have New Zealand Sign Language (NZSL) as a language of communication. 3% NSZL and 4% NZSL signs combined with English. 71% (5/7) of this group have needs in addition to deafness/hearing impairment







• 39% (7) children in Tai Tokerau are attending Te Kohanga Reo programmes
